Purpose

This Covenant establishes the shared values, responsibilities, and standards of conduct for all members, residents, facilitators, and stewards of The Healing Arts Retreat Center & Collective (“the Community”).

The Community exists to support conscious living, healing arts service and practice, ecological stewardship, spiritual sovereignty, and peaceful cohabitation in alignment with the mission and vision of Goddess Flow International Inc.

Participation in the Community is a privilege and requires ongoing alignment with this Covenant. Goddess Flow International, The Sacred Council of Elders, and The Community Board will be ordained with ensuring this covenant is upheld with divine alignment.

♀ **Mission Statement** ♀

Our mission is to serve as a living sanctuary of embodied peace, love, and light—devoted to heart-centered living and the highest expression of embodied service to humanity.

We are dedicated to supporting the awakening of human consciousness through holistic healing, energy alchemy, and embodied spiritual practice. We offer our gifts as sacred service through immersive education, retreat experiences, and conscious communal living, guiding the collective back to divine remembrance, inner harmony, and the living experience of Heaven on Earth—the Garden of Eden within.

We are here to steward sacred community, sacred Earth, and sacred humanity. Through this stewardship, we cultivate conscious, sustainable systems of natural health, wellness, nourishment, and regenerative living that restore balance between humanity, nature, and spirit.

Our purpose is to empower individuals and families to live in their embodied truth, purpose, power, and passion—fully anchored within themselves and in alignment with divine intelligence. We support the remembrance of unity, oneness, and sacred connection to the One, the All, the Divine within and without—as above, so below.

We are devoted to building a New Earth rooted in love, integrity, reverence for life, and conscious co-creation.

Our vision is to co-create a living sanctuary rooted in sacred stewardship of the Earth—beginning with the intentional investment in land that can be held, nurtured, and developed in alignment with nature and conscious community.

We envision the establishment of a regenerative retreat center that serves as a home for healing, remembrance, and embodied transformation. This sacred space will hold immersive retreats, education, and healing arts experiences dedicated to personal and collective awakening.

Within this land-based sanctuary, we envision the emergence of a soul-aligned village—where individuals and families live in conscious community, shared purpose, and mutual support, guided by principles of harmony, respect, and collective care.

We are devoted to cultivating food sovereignty through regenerative agriculture, growing our own food, and developing sustainable systems that restore connection to the Earth and support long-term ecological balance and self-sufficiency.

Through healing arts retreats, gatherings, and conscious festivals, we create offerings that serve humanity while also sustaining the financial vitality of the community. These experiences become pathways of sacred service, education, and empowerment—supporting both individual transformation and collective thriving.

Ultimately, our vision is to build a regenerative model of living where land, community, healing, and purpose are woven together—supporting freedom, sustainability, and the remembrance of our interconnectedness with all life.

1. Alignment & Initiation

All Community members agree to:

- Community Regenerative Land Projects, Community Sacred Exchange, & Community Build Model, Community Revenue Distribution Model, and all phases of development outlined in the Divine Plan
- Complete the required Goddess Flow Immersion Initiation for foundational training and energetic divine alignment designated for community membership.
- Enter the Community in emotional maturity, self-responsibility, and integrity.
- Maintain behaviors that support peace, cooperation, and collective wellbeing.
- Release patterns of behavior that disrupt safety, harmony, or mission alignment.

The Community reserves the right to pause, remediate, or revoke participation if alignment is consistently breached.

2. Plant-Based, Meat-Free Community Standard

This Community is strictly plant-based and meat-free.

Members agree that:

- No animals shall be hunted, slaughtered, harmed, or killed for food on Community land by its members.
- No meat shall be brought onto the land or consumed by members or guests.
- Community kitchens, shared spaces, retreat spaces, and events shall operate as 100% plant-based. Vegetarians in transition are acceptable.

- This standard applies to residents, guests, facilitators, retreat participants, and visitors.

This principle is foundational to the Community's values of high vibrational living, eating, and community.

3. Land Stewardship & Sacred Use

A. Private Land Stewardship Rights

Members are granted:

- **Exclusive stewardship, use, and occupancy rights** to a designated sacred land parcel, in accordance with the community guidelines within the divine plan, Covenant Based Land Stewardship Agreement, and the Healing Arts Collective Covenant Agreement
 - **Long-Term legacy land rights**, transferable to approved beneficiaries who remain aligned with community values, covenants, and governance structures
 - The right to **design and build personal eco-conscious dwellings** on their parcel, at the sole cost and responsibility of the Member, subject to approved ecological, architectural, and sacred design standards
 - The right to reside on and steward their parcel as a **private sanctuary within the collective ecosystem**, while remaining in harmony with the greater community

B. Land Holding & Transfer Restrictions

- All land is held by Goddess Flow **International and will later be transferred under a sovereign trust** and/or non-profit entity and is not individually owned in fee simple
 - Member stewardship rights must remain with an **approved community member in good standing**
 - Land may NOT be:
 - Sold on the open market
 - Transferred without approval
 - Exit options include:
 - **Transfer back to Goddess Flow International/ Land Trust/ or Non- Profit OR**
 - Transfer to a **new approved Member**, subject to review and approval by:
 - Healing Arts Collective Community Board
 - Goddess Flow International Inc.
-

C. Sacred Stewardship Responsibilities

Members agree to:

- Treat all land, water, structures, and shared spaces as **sacred**, honoring the energetic and physical integrity of the community

- Maintain their personal parcel in a **clean, sanitary, and ecologically responsible condition**
- Respect clearly defined **boundaries** of all personal and shared parcels
- Avoid **encroachment** of personal belongings, structures, or materials onto another Member's land or Retreat Center property
- Participate in the **shared stewardship** of:
 - Roads
 - Gardens
 - Ceremonial spaces
 - Communal facilities

As aligned, assigned, or agreed upon within the community structure

D. Sacred Use of Land

- The land is held in **protected trust** and may not be:
 - Exploited
 - Commercialized outside approved offerings
 - Used in any way that violates the **mission, vision, or energetic integrity** of Goddess Flow International Inc. and The Healing Arts Collective mission and vision.

E. Family Participation

- **Immediate household family members** may reside on the Member's parcel as part of the Member's primary household.
 - **Non-immediate family members** are welcome to **visit** the property, provided they:
 - Abide fully by the **Healing Arts Collective Community Covenant** while on the premises
 - Respect all community guidelines, land use standards, and shared spaces
 - Non-immediate family members may **reside on the land or stay beyond a temporary visit only if they:**
 - Complete **The Goddess Flow Immersion Initiation**
 - Fully agree to and uphold the **Community Covenant Agreement**
 - Receive approval from **Goddess Flow International Inc.** and/or the **Healing Arts Collective Community Board**, if required
 - **All adult participants (18+)** residing on the land, regardless of relation, are required to complete initiation and be in alignment with community standards.
 - A sacred contribution **to the community in an offering of \$444 per person** applies for non-immediate family members participating in the initiation, unless otherwise approved or adjusted at the discretion of **Goddess Flow International Inc.**

F. Sacred Exchange Residency Members

The **Sacred Exchange Residency Pathway** is distinct from **Private Land Stewardship**.

Sacred Exchange Residents:

- Do not hold private land stewardship rights
 - Are granted **temporary or permanent residency and occupancy privileges** within designated community housing or shared living spaces in the sacred exchange residency grounds.

Sacred Exchange Residency is based on:

- **Service, contribution, and energetic alignment** with the mission of Goddess Flow International
 - Exchange may include (but is not limited to):
 - Land stewardship and Garden infrastructure
 - Building and infrastructure support
 - Healing arts offerings
 - Community service roles
 - Retreat center operations

Sacred Exchange Residency Terms:

- Residency is:
 - **Non-transferable**
 - Subject to periodic review
 - Continued residency is contingent upon:
 - Active participation
 - Alignment with community values
 - Upholding all agreements and covenant standards
-

Governance & Approval:

All Sacred Exchange Residents must:

- Be approved by:
 - Goddess Flow International Inc.
 - Complete:
 - Collective application
 - 1:1 Energetic Screening
 - Initiation
 - Agreement signing
-

All Members and Residents, regardless of pathway, are called to:

- Walk in integrity

- Honor the land as a living entity
- Contribute to the collective field of healing, embodiment, and sacred co-creation

Personal Infrastructure Responsibility (Solar & Utilities)

Each Member is responsible for the **design, installation, permitting (if required), maintenance, and cost** of all solar power, water, and energy systems serving their personal parcel, except where systems are provided through community-developed infrastructure.

- All personal installations must align with:
 - Community sustainability guidelines
 - Safety standards
 - Aesthetic harmony with the land and sacred design principles
- **Community-wide infrastructure systems**, including but not limited to:
 - Solar arrays
 - Water systems
 - Shared utilities and communal systems
 - Retreat Center infrastructure

shall remain a **collective responsibility**, and may be supported and funded through:

- Communal contributions
- Program revenues
- **Received private donations allocated to the collective**, in alignment with:
 - Phased land development
 - Infrastructure priorities
 - Evolving community needs

Permitting Philosophy & Low-Impact Infrastructure Covenant

The Healing Arts Collective is intentionally designed as a **low-impact, off-grid, and regenerative community**, prioritizing building methods and infrastructure systems that:

- Minimize environmental impact
- Align with natural and sustainable living principles
- Reduce reliance on formal permitting processes where legally permissible

Community Standard

Members agree to:

- Design and construct structures and systems that **generally do not require formal permitting**, where such exemption is allowed under applicable county and state laws
 - Utilize **low-impact, non-permanent, or alternative building methods** (including but not limited to earth-based, mobile, or temporary structures) that align with this intention

Legal Compliance Clause

- Nothing in this Agreement or Covenant shall be interpreted to authorize or require any Member to violate applicable laws, regulations, or governmental requirements
 - Each Member is solely responsible for:
 - Understanding applicable Apache County and Arizona regulations
 - Determining whether permits are required for their specific structure or system
 - Obtaining any permits if legally required
-

Community Position on Permitting

- The community **does not require permits as a condition of internal approval**, unless deemed necessary for:
 - Safety
 - Structural integrity
 - Protection of the land or collective
 - The community **does not proactively seek permitting for systems that are legally exempt**, and encourages designs that remain within such exemptions
-

Shared Responsibility

Members acknowledge that:

- The community operates in a region with **limited active code enforcement**, however
- This does **not eliminate legal responsibility or risk**

Each Member assumes full responsibility for any outcomes related to:

- Building decisions
 - Permitting status
 - Compliance or non-compliance with external authorities
-

This covenant reflects the collective intention to:

- Live in harmony with the land
 - Build responsibly and consciously
 - Maintain autonomy while honoring both **natural law and man-made law where applicable**

Collective Values & Support

The Healing Arts Collective is rooted in the understanding that we are a **community of love, stewardship, and shared intention.**

- While each Member maintains **sovereignty and responsibility** over their personal systems and parcel infrastructure,
 - The collective operates with the intention that **all essential needs are supported, met, and harmonized within the community ecosystem**, as resources, alignment, and development allow

Unless otherwise agreed upon in writing by:

- Goddess Flow International Inc.
- The Healing Arts Collective Community Board

each Member remains fully responsible for the infrastructure and systems serving their personal parcel.

4. Community Conduct, Safety & Sacred Exchange

All members commit to upholding the highest standards of conduct, safety, and sacred responsibility to preserve the vibrational integrity of the land, community, and all beings.

4.1 Respectful and Non-Violent Living

- Practice non-violence, non-harassment, and respectful communication at all times.
- Honor physical, emotional, psychological, and spiritual boundaries of all members, guests, elders, children, and animals.
- Abstain from abusive, threatening, manipulative, or coercive behavior.
- Foster an environment of clarity, presence, and harmony, contributing to the high vibrational integrity of the community.

4.2 Substance-Conscious Environment

- Uphold a vibration-conscious and sober lifestyle, illegal, pharmaceutical, and recreational substances, including smoking, are prohibited, ensuring the sacred, high-frequency vibration of the land and atmosphere are maintained.
- Psychedelics, cannabis, mushrooms, ayahuasca, or other mind-altering substances are also prohibited, as the community operates in alignment with higher consciousness, next level ascension, and natural divine connection through life force energy.

- Smoking, drinking alcohol or consuming any hallucinogenic or drug is strictly not allowed.

4.3 Sacred Exchange & Stewardship

- Treat all land, structures, gardens, and shared spaces as sacred.
- Contribute time, energy, and service in alignment with sacred exchange principles, supporting the growth and sustainability of the community in sacred reciprocity.
- Participate in shared stewardship of roads, gardens, ceremonial spaces, and communal facilities as assigned and aligned.
- Your work and sacred service on Retreat Center land and communal areas grants the opportunity to host retreats and sacred services, under a community revenue distribution model, feeding both self-sustainability and collective growth.
- Members are encouraged to share skills, labor, and knowledge, fostering mutual support, equality, and the cultivation of deep bonds of trust.

4.4 Firearms, Weapons & Community Protection Protocols

Our community is founded upon a sacred covenant of peace, sacred non-violence, and reverence for life, while recognizing the responsibility to protect the safety and sovereignty of the land and all beings within it. The Divine Energy we carry is our Divine Protection.

Accordingly:

- Firearms are permitted solely for community protection, not for hunting, recreation, intimidation, or personal display.
- Firearms may not be carried in communal or ceremonial spaces or open carry.
- Discharge of firearms is not permitted except under clearly defined safety and protection protocols, solely to safeguard the community, land, children, families, elders, guests, animals, or infrastructure from imminent harm with the intention to hold all life as sacred.
- All firearm use must be conducted with discernment, restraint, and mindfulness, honoring the sacred, non-violent nature of the community and the presence of children and families.
- Firearms must be securely stored and handled responsibly in accordance with applicable laws and community safety standards.
- Any misuse, unauthorized possession, or discharge outside approved protocols constitutes a serious violation of the Community Covenant and may result in immediate removal from the land.

We Decree and Declare:

This land is consecrated ground.

The land has a dome of protection above and beneath.

No harm shall come upon our dwelling place.

We are protected from all harm and danger.

We are one with the earth and all that is.

There is no threat that we need to protect ourselves from because we have created a sacred safe haven where violence and war does not exist.

We trust in the divine protection generated through high vibrational coherence, right relationship, and spiritual integrity.

We believe that the frequency we hold together—peace, love, reverence, and unity—creates the reality we live within.

As a community, we consciously seal this land in a living dome of divine protection, an energetic sanctuary held in prayer, presence, and right action. Within this field, harm dissolves, danger is neutralized, and fear has no foothold.

Should conflict arise, it is met through:

- Conscious communication
- Restorative dialogue
- Spiritual accountability
- and Compassionate resolution

4.5 Protection of Vulnerable Populations

- The community is committed to safeguarding children, elders, guests, animals, and other vulnerable individuals.
- All interactions must prioritize consent, transparency, supervision where appropriate, and ethical conduct.
- Any behavior that threatens the safety, dignity, or well-being of others is grounds for immediate review by the Community Board and Sacred Council of Elders and potential removal from the community.

4.6 Animal Stewardship & Environmental Harmony

- The community is plant-based, meat-free, and aligned with principles of sacred nourishment and compassion, including animals when aligned.
- Members must ensure pets and livestock are contained within their designated parcels, with waste managed responsibly and ethically to maintain sanitary conditions and earth conservation.

- Animals may not roam onto other members' properties or Retreat Center communal areas without permission.
- Members are responsible for ecologically conscious practices, including water conservation, soil care, composting, and sustainable gardening.
- Collectively, members cultivate a Garden of Eden in harmony with natural rhythms, supporting the vibrational integrity of the land, all beings, and the broader Earth grid.

Failure to manage animals responsibly may result in removal of the animal or revocation of occupancy rights.

4.7 Upholding the Heaven on Earth Vision

- Each member agrees to act as a guardian of the field, understanding that this land is a living sanctuary.
- Members commit to:
 - Living in alignment with peace, love, responsibility, and spiritual sovereignty.
 - Supporting conflict resolution through mediation, council, and conscious dialogue rather than division.
 - Honoring the collective vision of a Heaven on Earth sanctuary through daily choices, conduct, and contributions.
 - Integrating sacred exchange principles into service, stewardship, and communal offerings to sustain and expand the community's mission and energy.

5. Children, Families & Education

The Healing Arts Collective is devoted to nurturing the next generation of New Earth Leaders, Healers, and Visionaries, guiding children back into harmony with:

- Nature
- Source
- The wisdom of the living Earth

We hold a shared vision of restoring a Garden of Eden consciousness—where children are free to grow, explore, and remember their innate connection to life, spirit, and creation.

Revenue, Operations & Sacred Exchange Structure

1. Operational Authority & Entity Flow

Goddess Flow International, Inc. (“GFI”) is the founding, operating, and stewarding nonprofit (or nonprofit-intended) entity responsible for The Goddess Flow International Healing Arts Retreat Center and The Healing Arts Community Village (collectively, the “Retreat Center”).

The Retreat Center is owned, operated, branded, and governed exclusively under GFI to ensure unified mission integrity, legal clarity, and centralized fiduciary oversight.

All operations, including but not limited to programming, events, land stewardship, sacred exchange systems, infrastructure development, and community administration, are conducted through GFI.

All practitioners, facilitators, and contributors participate solely as independent contractors or authorized program collaborators, and do not hold employee status, partnership rights, equity interest, or ownership claims.

This structure ensures:

- Unified operational governance
- Brand and mission continuity
- Legal and tax compliance alignment
- Collective coherence without ownership dilution

2. Practitioner Model: Independent & Collective Thriving

Practitioners engage in both independent and collective offerings within the Retreat Center ecosystem under written Independent Contractor and Sacred Exchange Agreements.

Each practitioner:

- Retains full creative and spiritual sovereignty over their offerings
- Operates as an independent contractor, not an employee or partner
- Is solely responsible for taxes, licensing, certifications, and insurance
- GFI provides mission-aligned infrastructure, including:
 - Sacred land access and facilities
 - Marketing, administrative, and booking systems
 - Payment processing and program coordination
 - Collective brand visibility and promotional amplification

3. Revenue & Sacred Exchange Model (Compensation Percentages Included)

All financial exchange within the Retreat Center is structured as mission-aligned sacred service compensation, not profit distribution, equity participation, or investment return.

A. Core Collective Offerings (GFI-Hosted Programs)

Programs, immersions, ceremonies, retreats, and trainings developed or hosted through GFI shall operate under the following compensation structure:

- 55% (Fifty-Five Percent) shall be allocated as reasonable compensation to practitioner(s), facilitator(s), and/or healing artists delivering the service
- 45% (Forty-Five Percent) shall be retained by GFI for mission-related operations and reinvestment

The 45% retained by GFI shall be used exclusively for:

- Land stewardship, acquisition, and ecological care
- Infrastructure development and facility maintenance
- Community services and operational expenses
- Educational programming and curriculum expansion
- Long-term sanctuary sustainability and development
- Mission-aligned expansion of programming

B. Aligned Guest Practitioners (External Facilitators)

External practitioners, teachers, and facilitators aligned with the mission may host offerings through GFI under the same structured sacred exchange model:

- 55% (Fifty-Five Percent) compensation to Guest Practitioner(s) for services rendered
- 45% (Forty-Five Percent) retained by GFI for land stewardship and operational sustainability

This structure ensures:

- Fair and reasonable compensation for services
- Cross-collaboration among healing arts practitioners
- Sustainable reinvestment into land and infrastructure
- Mission-aligned expansion of programming

C. Individual Member Offerings (Independent Use of Space)

Community members may independently host offerings, workshops, retreats, or services within Retreat Center facilities under approved Facility Use Agreements.

Under this model:

- 80% (Eighty Percent) of revenue is retained by the individual offering host
- 20% (Twenty Percent) is contributed to GFI as a Sacred Stewardship Contribution

The 20% contribution supports:

- Shared infrastructure and facility maintenance
- Utilities, land care, and operational costs
- Community programming and collective services
- Long-term sustainability of the sanctuary
- Mission-aligned expansion of programming

This structure preserves independent livelihood while honoring collective stewardship responsibility.

4. Financial Stewardship & Transparency

All revenue flowing through GFI shall be managed in accordance with nonprofit fiduciary standards, including:

- Ethical and transparent financial management
- Accurate bookkeeping and reporting systems
- Accountability to mission, covenant agreements, and governing board oversight

7. Sacred Exchange Residency

Sacred Exchange Residency Members acknowledge that:

- Sacred Exchange is a service-based stewardship role within the Healing Arts Community. It is a work-trade agreement rooted in sacred reciprocity, integrity, and alignment with the mission of Goddess Flow International.
 - Sacred Exchange is not a land ownership opportunity, land allotment, equity position, or future land claim.
 - Sacred Exchange Residency is in return for: Residency within designated staff living areas, Access to communal facilities and shared infrastructure, Participation in community life and approved revenue distribution opportunities
 - Sacred Exchange roles are contingent upon: Consistent, reliable service, alignment with community values and guidelines, Remaining in good standing
 - Sacred Exchange Placements may be revoked immediately if agreements are not honored.
 - Sacred housing space and community amenity access are granted only while actively fulfilling agreed-upon service commitments and maintaining good standing.
 - At the foundational phase: Only land and community access are guaranteed, Individuals must provide their own temporary living setup and essential resources (e.g., tent, water, solar, sanitation) until shared infrastructure is established.
 - A defined number of daily/weekly service hours is required to continue in Sacred Exchange Residency role
 - Sacred exchange contributions may include: Land stewardship and maintenance, Garden and food systems, Natural building and infrastructure, Retreat and guest support, Kitchen, bathhouse, and communal care, Administrative or operational support, Child-safety support, community-safe roles, aligned with individual gifts and needs

8. Governance, Councils & Accountability

Community Board:

- **Composition:** All founding members of the community are automatically part of the Community Board.
 - Oversees overall community decisions, shared financial accountability, and infrastructure development

- Represents the collective voice of the community members
- Ensures adherence to the Community Covenant, land stewardship policies, and sustainability principles

Sacred Council of Elders:

- **Composition:** Select spiritually mature, aware, and attuned members chosen by Goddess Flow International for their level of ascension, spiritual maturity, experience, ability, and sacred frequency they carry and uphold consistently to be an example and leader for the community—not based on age.
 - Provides spiritual guidance, energetic oversight, and wisdom-based governance
 - Upholds ceremonial, healing, and cultural traditions within the community
 - Supports mediation, conflict resolution, and maintaining harmony among members

Members agree to:

- Participate in governance and council processes when called.
- Respect decisions made by the Council of Elders, Community Board, and Trustees.
- Engage in mediation or restorative processes when conflict arises.
- Accept and respect outcomes designed to restore harmony and protect the Community.

Repeated or severe violations may result in suspension or termination of occupancy or membership rights.

9. Termination & Exit

The Community reserves the right to:

- Revoke membership or occupancy rights for sustained or serious violations of this Covenant.
- Require removal of personal structures or facilitate an orderly exit under defined procedures.
- Protect the land, mission, and collective integrity above individual interests.

The Council of Elders and Community Board may enforce this Covenant through fines, injunctions, or forced transfer of permanent structures for serious violations of this Covenant.

Voluntary Exit

If a member or Staff Steward determines that the community is no longer aligned for them, they may initiate a voluntary exit.

Voluntary exit requires:

- Written notice of intent to depart.
- Fulfillment or responsible transition of outstanding duties.
- Removal of personal belongings and temporary structures within the agreed timeframe.
- Restoration of their designated area to clean and orderly condition.

Sacred Exchange residency and access privileges conclude upon exit.

Land Stewardship & Transfer Policy

To uphold the sacred use and long-term integrity of the land:

- Land allotment must be held by an approved community member in good standing.
- Land may be transferred back to the Community.
- Land may be transferred to another party only with prior written approval from the Community Board.

This ensures the land is held for sacred, regenerative, and mission-aligned purposes and may not be:

- Transferred or assigned outside approved processes
- Exploited for personal gain in ways that violate the Community's mission
- Used in any manner that conflicts with the Healing Arts Community Covenant

All land stewardship decisions must honor the mission, collective vision, and sacred purpose of the Community.

10. Living Agreement

This Covenant is a living document and may evolve through governance processes.
